### **Mental Health Professional or Rehabilitative Support Associate, Crisis Residential Program**

#### **Responsibilities:**

- Provide rehabilitation services, contribute to and supports Crisis Residential clients
- Provide medication monitoring and community support
- Provides case management, counseling, skill development and emotional support to clients, based on individualized treatment goals and discharge plans
- Maintains MOR properly and assist clients to monitor medications so medications are available

#### **Qualifications:**

- Bachelor's Degree in Human Service Field or five years' experience in Mental Health field; we will also consider hiring an entry level RSA which requires a minimum age of 21, high school diploma, and skills in the field of services to adults
- Must have a valid Illinois driver's license, auto insurance, and automobile

### **Emergency Therapist, PEP – Sherman**

#### **Responsibilities:**

- Arrange psychiatric hospitalization and referrals as necessary

- Masters Degree in Social services, social work or counseling required
- Current LPC, LSW or AMFT license required, or ability to obtain it within 90 days of hire
- Crisis work experience preferred
- Must have valid Illinois driver's license, auto insurance and automobile

### **Mental Health Professional OR Rehabilitative Services Associate, Crisis Stabilization Program**

#### **Responsibilities:**

- Provides case management, counseling and emotional support to consumer, based on individualized treatment goals and discharge plans.
- Encourages, teaches, and supports skill development based on each consumer's treatment goals and discharge plan.
- Maintains MOR properly and assist clients to monitor medications so medications are available.
- Provides supervision of clients and maintains constant awareness of where each client is at all times.
- Records pertinent information and observations regarding interactions, behaviors, & psychiatric symptoms, etc. in progress notes.
- Communicates regularly with next shift and program supervisor regarding all pertinent information.
- Manages crises as they arise. Contacts appropriate authorities in an emergency & OIG in the case of a reportable allegation of abuse or neglect.

#### **Qualifications:**

- Bachelor's Degree in human services field or 5 years behavioral health experience including experience providing crisis intervention
- Experience working with adults with mental health and/or substance use needs
- Must have a valid Illinois driver's license, auto insurance, and automobile
- Ability to administer CPR
- Willingness to work a flexible schedule if needed

## Mobile Crisis Mental Health Professional, MCR

### Responsibilities:

- Provide crisis intervention and case management services in the community to clients referred to Mobile Crisis Team under the direction of a QMHP
- Provides triage, assessment, crisis de-escalation/resolution, coordination with local hospitals, police, fire, medical and behavioral health services, crisis planning and follow up. Manage walk-in, telephone and community-based crises.
- Delivers services primarily in the community where the client is located, including shelters and client homes.
- Provides referral and disposition options appropriate to the client's needs and safety including warm hand offs to referral sources. Schedules outpatient follow ups.
- Responds to Call4Calm requests and regional crisis call hubs such as the future 988.
- Evaluation of unfunded individuals and apply for Medicaid. Coordinates with CARES line for individuals funded with Medicaid.

### Qualifications:

- Bachelor's Degree in human services field or 5 years' experience including experience providing crisis intervention
- Experience working with adults and children with mental health and/or substance use needs
- Bilingual Spanish preferred
- Must be able to work independently and be willing to travel in the community (Kane County and nearby Cook)
- Willing to transport clients when appropriate, current drivers license, automobile, and auto insurance

## Mental Health Professional, Supported Apartment Program (SAP)

### Responsibilities:

- Provide rehabilitation services, contribute to and develop treatment plans and manage crisis for all residential clients
- Provide medication monitoring and community support
- Handle referrals and discharges for residential services
- Assist clients in obtaining/maintaining entitlements
- Contribute to and develop treatment plans and manage crisis for all residential clients

### Qualifications:

- Bachelor's Degree in Human Service Field or five years' experience in Mental Health field
- Must have good computer skills
- Willingness to work regularly scheduled hours, holidays and overtime in emergency situations
- Must have the ability to work cooperatively with mentally ill adults, and to administer CPR
- Must have valid Illinois driver's license, auto insurance and automobile

**Hours:** Monday & Wednesday 8am – 4:30pm, and either Saturday or Sunday 9am – 3pm, 22 hours/week

**Hiring Salary:** \$19 – \$20 hourly. Depending on skills and qualifications.

## Recovery Support Specialist, CSP

### Responsibilities:

- Provide treatment to and use lived experience in providing crisis intervention and case management services to adults with mental health and co-occurring mental health and substance use needs
- Delivers services, primarily in the form of crisis care, leading groups and providing psychoeducation, providing case management (including applying for/ maintaining public entitlements), admissions, discharges and IATP's
- Monitoring CSP milieu
- Supports gathering National Outcomes Measurements (NOMS) on all CSP admissions
- Provides triage, rapid evaluation/ assessment, preliminary diagnosis, brief crisis counseling, crisis de-escalation/resolution/care plan, coordination with local hospitals, police, fire, medical and behavioral health services, crisis planning, counseling, skill development and emotional support based on individualized treatment goals and discharge plans
- Provides referral and disposition options appropriate to the client's needs and safety including scheduling outpatient follow up and warm hand offs.

### Qualification:

- Recovery Support Specialists (RSS) draw on their own life experiences to help others develop and maintain their recovery from substance abuse disorders, mental health disorders, or dual diagnoses
- CRSS certification or capable of attaining the credentials in 18 months of hire
- Experience working with adults with mental health and /or substance use needs
- Bilingual Spanish preferred
- Must have valid Illinois driver's license, auto insurance and automobile
- Ability to administer CPR
- Willingness to work a flexible schedule if needed.
